They work in places like hospitals and clinics to help us feel better. Questions: Do you know what a doctor does? Have you ever seen a doctor or nurse? What did they do to help you? What would you like to ask a doctor or nurse if you met one? 2. How Do Doctors and Nurses Help Us Feel Better? Discussion Point: Doctors check to see what is wrong and give us medicine, while nurses take care of us when we need help. Questions: How do you think doctors know what is wrong when someone is sick?	Activity: Junk Modelling- Provide a wide range of resources (boxes, feathers, bottle tops, crate paper etc) for the children to explore, experiment and play with.
