#### Activity:

Read the story of Little Red Riding Hood. Can the children remember what her mother asked Little Red Riding Hood to do? Establish that Little Red Riding Hood's mother is her safe adult, she loves and looks after Little Red Riding Hood, so she tells her to stay on the path and go straight to her grandma's house. Did Little Red Riding Hood do what her mother asked? What should Little Red Riding Hood have done? Have some photos to help as prompts and discuss the following: What fun things do you do as a family? This might include things like: prepare/cook meals together; go out in the car/on the train or bus to visit somewhere or someone. Talk about these things and ask the children who cooks the meal? Or who buys the petrol for the car or the tickets for the bus/train? Establish that their safe adults (parents/carers) do these things because they love us and are looking after us – we know them well, they know us well and they keep us safe. Establish that they should always stay close to their safe adults when they are off visiting or outside of the home and never talk to someone they don't know. Repeat this discussion to establish the safe adults in the setting – practitioners, helpers, etc. Extend discussion if children really grasp the idea of who their safe adults are. Jigsaw Jenie might then ask the children:


