

<u>Activity:</u> Look at images of the mammoth in detail from the text. Children to paint their own mammoth.

Rising 3's

Show children different small world animals-how many can they name?

Activity: Play one of the songs and do all the actions to it. How does moving make you feel? How does vour body feel? Go outside and do an obstacle course together. Plan what each stage is going to be. Cheer each other on and time how long it takes to get the whole team through. Can you beat your time? Questions: What does your heart do when you are moving and exercising? Raise Jigsaw Jerrie Cat's paws to indicate to children that they need to PAUSE (Stop), take a deep breath in and out and say thank you to your body. Cool down back inside, explain that you need energy to do everything that you do in a day. If you want to have lots of energy, what things do you need to do/eat/drink to help? Rising 3's Head, shoulders, knees and toes song. Share with children, then ask them to participate x2.

Activity: Recap on key language: God Our Father Jesus The Son Sign of the cross We talk to people we love – share experiences – when, where, what do we say? When we talk to God we call this prayer. Explain to the children that when Jesus prayed he was talking to his Father. When we make the Sign of the Cross we are praying and talking to God the Father and his son Jesus. Reinforce this every time we use this at prayer.

<u>Activity:</u> Warm-up: Balancing bean bags on different body parts.

Balance beam walking (low to the ground or marked lines).

Catching and throwing soft balls with partners.

Hopping games (e.g., hopscotch, hopping over lines).
