What does this mean?

Catholic schools help their pupils grow by developing an eloquent language which pupils can use to understand and articulate their emotions, beliefs, and questions, encouraged by the example of their teachers to be truthful in the way they represent themselves and speak about the world.

Pray it

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Linking Eloquent and Truthful to prayers of the Church and Liturgical Season.

Prayer suggestions and activities:

- April 21 World Day of Prayer for Vocations: Pray the Diocesan Prayer for Vocations. for people to discern their that people will proclaim the truth of the Good News
- During the Easter Season, pray the Apostles Creed, a prayer which expresses the truths in which we believe.
- Include a renewal of Baptismal Promises in times of Prayer focusing on truths revealed in them.
- Pray to the Holy Spirit and ask for help so you are able to use the gifts and fruits.
- In the days leading up to the Feast of Pentecost, pray a Novena to the Holy Spirit. Remember in your prayers those who have recently joined the Church and those who are about to be confirmed.
- Pray for those who work within the justice and peace movement.

Linking Eloquent and Truthful to scripture, meaning and teachings of the Church, Pope Francis and the Saints.

Scripture to Explore:

- April 25 St. Mark, the Evangelist: Explore how St. Mark eloquently shared the 'Good News' in his Gospel accounts
- Explore the teachings of the Church through the Nicene or Apostle's Creed. What do Catholics believe?
- What is your favourite piece of scripture from the New Testament about Jesus and his teachings? How has it influenced you or other people?
- Learn about the lives of some of the 40 English Martyr's
 particularly those who lived and worked within the Archdiocese or those who we have schools dedicated to their
 memory. e.g St. Ambrose Barlow, St. Edmund Campion, St.
 Nicholas Owen, St. John Wall and St. Margaret Ward. What
 did they do to defend their faith?

Live it



Linking Eloquent and Truthful to the way we can choose to live our lives to serve God and to serve others.

Activities and challenges:

- Create Easter cards and posters to make it known to the Parish and local community that we are celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus.
- Research the work of organisations that live out Catholic Social Teaching by speaking out against injustice; CAFOD, Missio, Aid to the Church in Need and Columban Missionaries etc.
- Identify some issues of injustice in the local, National and Global Community, pray about this and explore what you can do to make others aware of these issues.
- Explore the work of pupil groups within your school. How are they living out the truth of the Gospel?
- Write to or invite your local MP into school to discuss a local or national issue of importance. Find your MP - <u>Find your MP - MPs and Lords - UK Parliament</u>
