Activity:

Show children a world map or globe and explain that the story they are going to read is set in Gunjur, a town in The Gambia, West Africa. Find The Gambia on the map or globe, then look at 'The Gambia picture cards'. Discuss the images in the photographs.

Images of Gambia

Watch: <u>Fatou Fetch the Water</u> Why do you think Fatou needs to fetch water from the well?

What do you think Fatou's mum does as a job?

Find the picture with the girls in their school uniform. How is their uniform similar to or different from your school uniform?

Are there any clues in the story that show you what the weather is like where Fatou lives?

Fatou and her friends and family are eating their meal outside. Do you ever eat outside?

Orally retell the story.

Activity:

Work together to create collages / paintings of all of the different animals in a safari-ready for the role play area.



Activity:

Sing the song, 'Head, shoulders, knees and toes' doing the actions, or 'Jenie says' naming body parts and doing something with it e.g. 'Jenie says nod your head, Jenie says wiggle your fingers'.

This can be done as a whole class or small groups. Using the labels and pictures of the different parts of the body, play a matching game. Children pick a label from the box and adult reads it. Can they find the matching body parts from the pictures? Begin to build up the pictures to create a whole body. Questions: Can you name different parts of the body? What do they do/why are they important? Raise Jigsaw Jerrie Cat's paws to indicate to children that they need to PAUSE (Stop), take a deep breath in and out and stretch as tall as you can.

Ask the children about what the different parts of the body do or help you do (e.g. legs help you run around, fingers help you solve jigsaw puzzles).


