Discuss: /Activity: Explain this week is England week. Discuss the story, key vocabulary. Share images of England-what is the weather like, landscape? Which animals can you see? London PP	Activity: Discuss the England Flag Meaning and colours. The red cross on a white background of the St George's Cross flag is steeped in symbolism. The red represents courage, sacrifice, and the bloodshed in defence of England. The white signifies purity, peace, and the enduring spirit of the English people. Ask the children which they like best and encourage them to say why. Invite the children to sit in a circle together.
